

Mt Martha Basketball Club Uniforms

History and Context:

In 2009, Mount Martha Basketball Club (MMBC) received a grant from Woolworths to assist in the purchase of club uniforms. Uniforms were designed by Michael Perry, parent of Eden and Ally, and endorsed by the new committee. In 2010, the money from the Woolworths grant allowed the club to purchase and distribute new uniforms to all registered team members.

Historically, uniforms were the property of the club. A uniform levy was charged as part of the membership fee and uniforms were exchanged or returned as required. A Uniform Officer was appointed to the Committee. As the uniforms aged and the Club grew, the ownership of uniforms returned to the players. Since 2013, newly registered players were asked to purchase their own uniforms through the club.

Mt Martha Basketball Club Uniform Policy

Mount Martha Basketball Club (MMBC) uniforms are distinctive and foster team unity and a sense of belonging, which aims to motivate players to participate and enrich their experience, within their team and the Club. The uniform creates solidarity between players and fans.

Players are required to purchase a MMBC uniform through the website. The uniform is retained as their own personal property. Payment is required when the order is placed. The cost of the uniform will be determined by the cost price provided by the manufacturer and will take into account any delivery or administration fees imposed on the Club to cover costs.

Owners of used uniforms can return them to MMBC in good faith. Second hand tops may be loaned at no cost to new members if purchased tops are delayed. Loaned tops will be returned to the club for use as deemed fit by the committee.

MMBC members must wear the Club's reversible singlet and Club shorts. -If the correct uniform is not worn by any member during a match, it is up to the discretion of the referees and any officials of the stadium to enforce uniform penalties. This may result in points being awarded to the opposition team for each incorrect item.

The uniform manufacturer is endorsed by the Committee and wherever possible will support local industry and workers. Environmental and social responsibility will be considered as part of the procurement practices of the Club.

At the discretion of the Committee, a reduced uniform price may be provided to support participation where financial assistance is required.
