### **President's Report**

Welcome everyone and thank you for attending the Annual General Meeting.

My name is Simon Waller and I took over the President role from Elana Welsh earlier this year. Thankfully we've retained Elana's deep experience on the committee with Elana taking on the role of Vice-President. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Elana for her time at the helm of Mount Martha Basketball Club and the contribution she continues to make to the club.

Since taking over I've been working with the committee to improve the value proposition for all our volunteers. This means trying to make the act of volunteering easier as well as helping our volunteers get more out of the experience. A couple of examples of this is the coaching kits that were provided to all our coaches, and at the committee level there has been a lot of work to improve and streamline communications and processes for our age coordinators. This work is particularly important as our committee is now managing 25% more teams and 25% more players than they were just a year ago and nearly double the number of players than before the pandemic.

Mount Martha Basketball Club is a completely volunteer run club and our aim is to keep it that way. Not only does this provide the best value for our members, I believe volunteering is also an important part of a strong community. I know many of our parent members volunteer in a wide range of community projects including other sporting clubs and obviously there are many that also volunteer as either team managers or coaches within the MMBC. That being said, we are always looking for people to contribute their time and expertise to the club and I'd encourage you to talk to me or one of the other committee members if you're keen to see how you can contribute.

Another big initiative from the last 12 months was the awards day held down at Rosebud stadium. This required significant effort from across the committee but would not have been possible without the incredible contribution of Kerrie Seager who headed up the event. Kerrie has since moved on from that role and has taken on the responsibility of club secretary which is the role I vacated when I took on the Presidency. The reason I raise this is that community liaison role that Kerrie was acting in is currently vacant. And what this means is that unless we can fill that role on the committee then it's unlikely that we will be able to run the awards event again next year. We'd love for this to be a regular event for the club, but I don't believe it's realistic for the existing committee members to take on without additional support.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to thank a couple of committee members who have stepped down in the last year. To Cherie Petley and Luke Marshall, thank you both for your contribution to the club.

And to Cath van Wijngaarden, Mel Hoskin, Robyn Blundell and Sarah Ogilvy, welcome to the committee and thank you as being part of the club's future.

Moving forward, the single biggest challenge the Club faces is the limited availability of court space on the Mornington Peninsula. I recently attended a meeting of the Peninsula Project which is a task group made up of Mornington, Southern Peninsula and Westernport Basketball Associations. It was clear from that meeting that no new courts will be built on the Peninsula over the next five years.

What this means is that as a Club we will need to increasingly work with other associations such as Southern Peninsula and Westernport if we continue to grow.

As it stands, we feel comfortable that existing teams at Mornington will be able to re-enrol for subsequent seasons, but we are already starting to enrol new teams into other competitions. Because of this we are also making changes to the registration process. Rather than register with a team you will register with the club and the club will then enrol players into their teams. This will give us the greatest flexibility to register teams at Mornington and ensure waitlisted players are given spots on team rosters when they open. Obviously existing players in a team will be given first opportunity to re-register for the same team.



#### **General Business**

- 1. Constraints on court space
- 2. Proposed registration process for Summer 23/24
  - New players sign up to a waitlist on PlayHQ and pay a registration fee to the Club (this is ongoing)
  - New season opens on PlayHQ
  - Existing players register with the Club (not the team) on PlayHQ and pay a registration fee to the Club
  - Age Coordinators create teams on PlayHQ and assign existing players to teams.
  - Once availability is confirmed for new players (either gaps in teams or new teams), players on waitlist are contacted t register with the Club on relevant association. They are provided a voucher so they don't have to pay the Club registration fee again.
  - New players are registered to teams by Age Coordinators.
  - Any new players not placed are provided a refund or rolled over to the next season. From a player and parent perspective the most significant change will be registering with the Club rather than directly with the team. This will reduce the number of errors where parents with more than one child playing accidently uses the wrong sign up link. It will also simplify the communication process (one link for all existing players) and it will also ensure that players on the waitlist are prioritised in terms of playing spots on teams.
